



## TCA - Raising Achievement Strategies

 'The greater danger for most of us lies not in setting our aim too high and falling short; but in setting our aim too low, and achieving our mark' – Michelangelo

 It is far better to set your goals high and to only just miss them than to set your goals low and actually meet them





Almost any person in a top job will tell you the same thing. If you want to be a real success and achieve your aims, **now** is the time to start setting those ambitious goals.

'I can remember absolutely freaking out when I saw that my target grades from my teachers were all As or A\*s (like getting 9s today). I actually thought I'd never achieve them - and to be honest in some subjects I didn't! But I think that push – that motivation I had to achieve those highest grades meant that in some subjects I achieved a B, where otherwise I might have got Cs or Ds. That would not have been good enough for me to study law.'

- Quality first teaching delivered in every Year 11 lesson across all subjects
- Effective homework set and monitored using Class Charts to support extended learning
- P6 lessons, selected subjects pre mock Timetabled for students following Mock Exams
- Staffed study room with ICT facilities and revision resources available for Year 11
- Year 11 absence chased as a priority by phone call daily

Extra Support

- Zorba Department led process department targeted groups and individual students
- Whole school Zorba focused on key cohort
- Assertive Mentoring for all students, minimum of 6 times with key focus at each
- Selected students to work with Action Tutoring around revision, study skills and other key areas
- Maths and English Core PE intervention groups
- Revision strategies ECO Days (Claire Gatsby) including parents' revision and study skills evening
- Frequent Achievement assemblies for year 11

- Mock Results day following January mock examinations Students discuss results with HoF/SLT and follow up targets set, shared with Assertive Mentors for follow up actions by students
- Easter and May Half-term revision sessions students selected and invited by departments
- Exam Warm-ups before all summer exams Breakfast supplied for morning exams

### Assertive Mentoring

- Every Year 11 student has an Assertive Mentor
- Each mentor will be working with between 4 and 5 students
- First mentor meeting in this week
- Alongside tutors, mentors to become first port of call for issues with achievement in Year 11
- Close link into Teaching and Learning strategies.
- Supportive of students no matter their current targets or grades.



#### Intervention - P0 and P6

- P0 and P6 sessions will be put onto some students timetables
- These sessions will be part of the school day and attendance will be required
- If students make good progress, attendance at these sessions will be reviewed (approx. 6 week cycle)
- Students should have a <u>maximum</u> of three P0 and P6 sessions on timetables, but can choose to attend more.



## Study Lounge

- P6 study lounge will be made available to Year 11 only
- These sessions are a study space, not a social space
- They will take place in an IT room
- For most, attendance will be voluntary, but for some this may be included on timetables



#### Year 11 Mock Exams

- Before the January exams, we will send out a copy of the overview timetable - This will go on the website and to parents
- Students will also receive a personalised timetable
- February half—term revision sessions will be timetabled
- Easter revision sessions will be timetabled
- May half-term revision sessions will be timetabled
- Students will receive an invite to sessions, but can also opt in to the published programme




#### Summer Homework

- All students will receive homework across all subjects
- Promoting independent learning and revision
- Will make use of available online platforms


