




Core Purpose













Behaviour can have a negative sound, we will use the word 'culture'

These allow you to record and celebrate what you take part in outside of the classroom and are skills for your future.




Why does it matter?

Academy Student Code of Conduct Our culture and ethos

As a member of the community at The Carlton Academy, I must:

- · Listen to members of staff and follow instructions politely and calmly
- be polite to all I encounter: staff, visitors and fellow students and treat all people as I would wish to be treated
- go straight to lessons, holding doors open for others when corridors are busy
- walk in a single file in corridors and stairs, keeping to the left, without running or causing a
 disturbance and with coats off
- · respect other people's privacy and family life so they are not offended by what I say or do
- never insult, undermine or swear at anytime
- never engage in any other form of physical abuse towards anyone at anytime
- · never touch other people's property, and treat their belongings with respect
- Respect the academy facilities at all times keeping them clean and tidy for all members of our

To show that I am an ambassador for which (the Academy can be proud I will...

- dress smartly, in correct uniform at all times, including to and from school
- · care for my uniform by hanging it up at the end of the day and keeping it clean
- have respect for the Academy's neighbours and be helpful and considerate in the local community
- be aware of other people around me on the streets, in shops, on buses nevershout or behave in a way that will affect others (we share pavements and transport)
- speak quietly and politely to my friends without using poor language
- · offer my seat where possible to an older person/mother with young children
- make my way to and from The Carlton Academy quickly and not congregate in large groups in the local area
- I understand that there will be consequences if I do not adhere to the Code of Conduct.

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Red lines

The Carlton Academy – Red Lines

As staff, we all model what we expect of students in all that we do and how we work with each other regardless of role. Consistency with the highest of expectations is vital to our ethos and success as this is our culture.

- Students in years 7-11 line up quietly when waiting outside classrooms and staff meet and greet students at the door when they come into the classroom, uniform is checked at the point of entry to the classroom and any issues rectified within the school systems
- All students in years 7-11 stand silently behind chairs when they have entered the room and sit when asked to do so by the teacher
- Staff are always referred to by their name, Sir or Miss and staff use students names
- Everyone present is silent and listening when the teacher addresses the whole class during the lesson
- A seating plan is used to promote positive relationships and high levels of progress. These are reviewed regularly by teachers.

- All lessons have clear reference to objectives and graded outcomes which students can understand and explain if asked – these do not always have to be written but should be evident to those in the classroom as part of their learning and progress
- Low level disruption is always challenged and never tolerated in line with the academy behaviour system, which is applied consistently and fairly.
- Students who work well are praised and rewarded using The Carlton Learner achievement points system regardless of their year group and including post 16
- At the end of the lesson, all students stand silently behind chairs and are dismissed by the teacher with all uniform correct and the classroom tidy.
- As a staff team, we all challenge students in corridors, specifically in respect to uniform, phones, sensible movement, litter and language.

Things that we simply will never budge on. This develops our culture.
