

Uniform Expectations

From the moment students enter the school gates to the moment they leave, our expectation is that students follow the uniform rules.

This uniform should include:

- The Carlton Academy tie
- The Carlton Academy blazer
- The Carlton Academy skirt/trousers worn appropriately
- Plain white shirt
- Plain black socks or tights
- Plain black school shoes (no heel, trainer or boot style)
- Only one stud per ear, no other jewellery
- No make-up
- No long, painted or false nails
- Pupils also require a Carlton Academy sports t-shirt



The Academy does not allow students to be on their phones at any time inside the school gates. Phones should not be seen or heard throughout their time on school site, including before and after school.

The Start and end of the day

A member of staff will greet students at the beginning and at the end of the day, ensuring that all students are in the correct uniform and conducting themselves in a calm, controlled manner. Students are expected to make their own way to their lessons and line up quietly outside the classroom with equipment ready in hand: blue/black pen x2, red pen, pencil and ruler.

Lesson departure

We expect students to calmly pack away at the end of lessons when their teacher instructs them to. Students should stand behind their chairs quietly before they are dismissed by their teacher.

Transitions between lessons

We expect students to move to and from their lessons in a quiet, controlled, and appropriate manner. Teachers will be monitoring the corridor activities and if students don't meet these expectations, they will be sanctioned accordingly.



Behaviour in lesson

Students should show respect to staff, as well as other students, both in and outside their lessons. They should address staff properly e.g. 'Yes, Sir/Miss'. Being respectful within the learning environment means following instructions to the best of their ability and listening attentively, ensuring a focused atmosphere without creating distraction. Having equipment and homework ready allows lessons to flow without disruption.

Behaviour in assemblies

When students have assemblies, they should line-up in silence outside the Theatre until they are asked to enter in an orderly manner. They need to stand at their seat until they are greeted by the person delivering the assembly and asked to take a seat.

Social time

Students have designated areas in which they can and cannot go during their social time. If students are queuing, they are expected to do it in an orderly way and will be removed from the queue if they don't. Gathering or lingering in the toilets will not be accepted even during social times. Food is not to be consumed in the toilets. Once the bell rings, students must make their way to their lesson. Littering will not be tolerated.

Rewards and Sanctions

Teachers will note both positive and negative (including sanctions) points on Class Charts. To celebrate positive achievement points we award certificates for the different levels of achievement points awarded:




Bronze award 200 Achievement points
