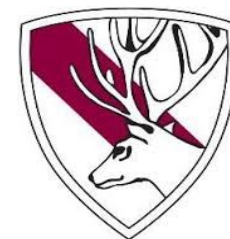

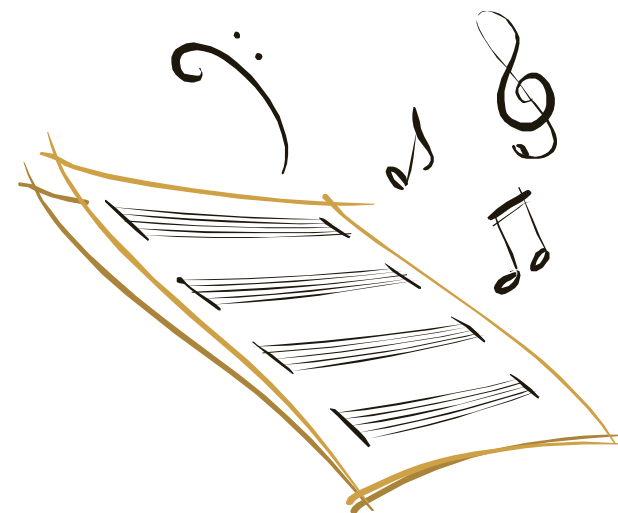

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ABOUT THE SCHEME

Lessons

Students are taught in groups or individually, dependent on instrument. Lessons last 20 minutes and usually take place in lesson time, with times rotated so that students do not miss too much of any one subject.

Fees

For the academic year 2022-2023 fees are £70 per instrument per term, payable in advance at the start of each term. Tuition is subsidised by the school and compares very well with other schools and private tuition - currently around £30 an hour.

A minimum of 10 lessons in a term is guaranteed. Some terms may consist of between 14-15 lessons. If a member of staff is absent, there will not be a replacement lesson due to the minimum guaranteed 10 lesson policy.

Students in receipt of free school meals are entitled to one free instrumental lesson a week. Any additional instruments will be charged at the full rate.

GCSE music students

All students who have opted for GCSE music are entitled to one free instrumental lesson per week.

Cancellation

Parents and students must give a terms notice if they wish to discontinue their lessons.

Due to high demands for instrument tuition we operate a policy in which students who fail to attend their lessons for three weeks consecutively, lose their place on the instrumental register.

Instruments

Various school instruments are available for hire. For those using a school instrument an additional declaration form is to be signed in advance of taking the instrument home. It is the parents' responsibility to insure any instrument on loan from school. An all-risk House Contents policy is adequate.

Music, reeds, accessories, etc. should, where possible, be supplied by parents.

A school instrument will be provided, although you may wish to consider purchase in the light of good progress and enjoyment. Parents are invited to contact the school for advice before making a purchase.

Reports

Students will receive an instrumental report during the Summer term. This will be sent out with their third progress report.

Commitment

A considerable degree of commitment is required on the part of both pupils and parents - regular practice, as advised by the teacher, is essential if real progress is to be made.

An integral part of playing an instrument is joining a group of some kind. **It is compulsory that all students who are accepted for tuition will support the Music Department by taking part in at least one of the extra-curricular groups. If students do not attend an extra-curricular ensemble, they will lose their place on the instrumental register.**

These include:

Singing Group, Anything Goes Band, Brass Group, House Band

Selection Of Students

All students are invited to apply for tuition. However, as both places and instruments are limited, students may be auditioned for suitability. Although previous experience, such as playing the recorder or singing in a choir, is useful, it is not essential and no student will be penalized for any lack of experience.

Enthusiasm and commitment are considered almost more important than musical ability.

Parents' support and encouragement are vital for students' success
